2006 SIEBEL COMPUTER SCIENCE SCHOLARS ANNOUNCED

Five graduate students in the School of Computer Science (SCS) have been selected as Siebel Scholars for 2006-2007. Each year the Siebel Scholars program honors five of the most talented graduate students at SCS and at each of nine other leading computer science and business schools. Three of this year's recipients are studying for master's degrees: **Michael Dille**, computer science; **Michael Heilman**, language technologies; and **Lucia de Lascurain Hinojosa**, software engineering. Two are pursuing doctorate degrees: **Pradeep Ravikumar**, machine learning; and **Adam Wierman**, computer science. Each scholar receives \$25,000 to defray tuition and expenses for the final year of graduate study. The program was established in 1999 by Tom Siebel, entrepreneur and founder of Siebel Systems, with the goal of nurturing the best and brightest graduate students in computer science and business.
